The Armory Show announces Armory Spotlight, the first program in the fair's history to provide a complimentary booth to a premier New York cultural institution each year. A new extension of the fair's decade-long Cultural Partners Program, the inaugural Armory Spotlight honors The Kitchen, one of New York City's oldest not-for-profit spaces that presents a robust, multidisciplinary program of art and performance. The legendary experimental arts institution will present at the fair rarely

seen selections from its expansive archive in celebration of the vital contributions of its artists over time.

Founded in 1971, The Kitchen has had a profound local, national, and international impact for 50 years. As part of an ongoing effort by the institution to turn its archive inside-out and amplify access to its work, The Kitchen will invite attendees of the fair to delve deeper into its historic activities at a critical turning point in its history—a radical refraction of its mission.

Legacy Russell, Executive Director & Chief Curator of The Kitchen, said, "The Kitchen is thrilled to partner with The Armory Show. In a moment where experimentalism continues to be redefined and renegotiated, The Kitchen is a platform for artists across practices, perspectives, generations, and localities to push boundaries and to determine for themselves how they want to be represented and remembered through its artist-driven archive as a decolonized and wild site."
